MBB's Home Library Program expands from 32 schools to 50 schools.



OCTOBER 2021

The Bookmobile goes on its first visit since the onset of the pandemic and resumes programming.



SEPTEMBER 2019

MBB distributes our One Millionth Book and acquire our second Ravens Bookmobile.



JUNE 2017



MBB forms partnerships with Share Baby, Leveling the Playing Field, and Bedtime In A Box, and shapes the vision for the Baltimore Warehouse Collaborative.



MARCH 2014

The Book Bank and its programs are acquired by The Maryland Book Bank, a separate and independent nonprofit organization.



2024

MBB delivered Home Library Program to all 100 Title 1 city schools.

JUNE 2022

MBB partners with Amplify Education, The Literacy Lab, and Reading Partners to distribute Story Kits to 2,600 children enrolled in tutoring programs.

MARCH 2020

MBB pivots programming to distribute Story Kits to the homes of children experiencing time away from school due to COVID-19.

MBB moves to its current location, the Baltimore Warehouse Collaborative at 1794 Union Avenue.



AUGUST 2016

MBB enters into a partnership with the Baltimore Ravens and acquires the first of its MBB Ravens Bookmobiles.



Expanding Access, Enriching Futures

Equipped with evidence-based practices from studies of successful book distribution programs, the Maryland Book Bank launched its Home Library Program in 2014, piloting the program in several Baltimore City schools through 2016.

During the HLP pilot in 2014-2016, second graders receive five age-appropriate books per month from October through June. The pilot reached 300 students total across seven schools: City Springs Elementary, Hampstead Hill Elementary, Wolfe Street Academy, Elmer Henderson Elementary, Samuel Coleridge Taylor Elementary, Furman L. Templeton Elementary, and The Tunbridge School.

To begin to understand the impact of the HLP, The Book Bank examined NWEA test scores from students at Hampstead Hill Academy and Wolfe Street Academy, taken before the start of the Home Library Program and at the conclusion of the school year (and the program). Results: Students who participated in the program showed a statistically significant increase in their reading scores when compared with non-participantsamounting to a 17% advantage in test scores. The program was particularly effective for boys, whose interest in reading and reading ability are traditionally particularly difficult to improve.

While the number of books distributed and number of visits made by the HLP have varied over time, the core element of student choice in books has remained a constant.

Love for the Home Library Program

"An incredible aspect of the program is that students get to keep the books. I can't even begin to describe how the little faces light up when I explain this to them. This creates a sense of ownership and pride, especially when they're able to bring books home and share them with their families. For many of our students, this is the first time they've had access to books they can call their own, which has a lasting impact on their reading habits.

Bringing books directly to families and making reading accessible outside the classroom helps reinforce the idea that reading is a lifelong activity that goes beyond just school hours. It encourages families to read together, fostering a shared activity that can strengthen bonds and create a positive, reading-rich environment at home. It's also a reminder that learning and growing through books doesn't stop when the school bell rings."

A Home for Nonprofits

In 2017, the Book Bank gathered with other local resource distribution nonprofits Share Baby, Bedtime in a Box (BIAB), and Leveling the Playing Field (LPF) and began dreaming up the vision for a new home for organizations like ours to serve the community, together. We knew we could each put more resources toward our missions with a shared loading dock, flexible space for inventory, shared office space, and minimal overhead. In 2018, BIAB and LPF joined us in moving into the Baltimore Warehouse Collaborative (BWC), and Share Baby moved into a warehouse next door. For BIAB, the BWC served as an incubator to fuel growth into their own warehouse. For LPF, a thriving Baltimore warehouse has led to new warehouses in Philadelphia, Buffalo, Columbus, and Detroit. We have welcomed Break a Difference, an organization engaging youth of color in service opportunities in Baltimore, and The Movement Team, a mentoring and resource distribution nonprofit that reaches more than 10,000 community members each year.



A Treasure Trove of Free Books

Community members can browse and "shop" the Book Bank's stacks every Wednesday, Saturday, and by special appointment. The thousands of "shoppers" who come to the Book Bank every year truly multiply our impact; they gather books from our shelves and take them back to their own programs where they collectively serve tens of thousands of children in our community.



Since our inception, the Book Bank has trained over 350 people in inventory management and computer skills relevant to warehouse employment in partnership with the Mayor's Office of Employment Development. Now, we serve as an employer for members of the Maryland Corps, Service Year Option, and Baltimore's Youthworks summer jobs program. We take pride in offering meaningful employment, skill development, and leadership opportunities to the next generation.



"Christ Child Society Baltimore supports 14 partner groups (six Title I schools and eight resource centers/shelters) with Education and Literacy, Infant Care and Parenting, and Basic Needs Support. This year alone, our volunteers have collected 5,248 books from the Book Bank. Our efforts would not be nearly as strong without having you as a resource."

In the next five years, the Book Bank hopes to grow our collaborative space into a bigger warehouse. A Decade of Literacy in Bloom- 3 Million Books, 3 Million Smiles

Before we moved to Union Avenue, the Book Bank distributed, at most, 250,000 books each year. Now, thanks to our loading dock and ability to receive truckloads of books, we regularly exceed 500,000 books distributed per year.

Since 2014, we've distributed 3 million books! A stack of 3 million average-sized books would be about 47 miles tall. That's almost 8 times higher than Mount Everest!

The People Behind the Pages

The Book Bank is powered by the tireless energy and enthusiasm of volunteers. Some volunteers visit the Book Bank once, while others come back day after day or year after year. In 2024 alone, our six lead volunteers provided more than 2,500 hours of packing, sorting, and organizing; combined, that's more than a full time staffer at 40 hours per week.

"My family was first introduced to the Book Bank (then Baltimore Reads) by a family friend in 2001 after my son cleaned off his book shelf and found numerous books he no longer wanted. After visiting the Book Bank for the first time, the overwhelming need to get books into more homes and schools was clear, and our family began holding book drives and volunteering at Books for Kids Day until my son graduated from college more than 10 years later.

When I retired in 2011, I decided to continue my involvement by volunteering one day a week at the Book Bank. Ever since, I've been amazed by the incredible friends I've made and the staff's strong dedication to the mission. I take pride in working with others to make sure there are books ready and available on the Bookmobiles for kids to choose. Seeing the joy on children's faces makes all the hard work worthwhile.

I'm most proud of supporting the Story Kit program during the pandemic. It was so fun and impactful to select 5 books that matched each child's interests so they could receive personalized boxes at their homes. Book Drives

Community members also lead book drives that keep our shelves and Bookmobiles stocked with the latest books for all of the age groups we serve. Community drives bring in 15,000-20,000 books per month. Books for adults are processed and sold in our social enterprise to help fund our children's programming. Books for children and youth go right back into the community for a new reader to enjoy. Book drives are another great way to support the Book Bank and help us keep books out of landfills.

The Book Bank diverts about 1 million pounds of books from landfills per year through recycling, and distribution.

Books for Kids Day

This festive day of collecting books and celebrating volunteers and community support has been a mainstay for over 25 years. On this one day each spring, volunteers collect and sort 20,000-30,000 books. Our corporate and media partners help to make this event a success, including Von Paris Moving and Storage who donates trucks and staff every year to move all of our books and gear from the warehouse to the parking lot at Poly-Western and back again.

Board Volunteers

The Book Bank's Board of Directors began with a handful of committed community members meeting at the old Ryan's Daughter in Belvedere Square. Board Members Doug Woodward, Kristin Dodson, and Sarah Hackney have served on our Board for a combined 30 years and provided immense leadership and stability. Today, our 15-member Board is highly engaged and provides the skillsets and relationships to grow and guide the organization for years to come.


